
People in place & anchored in grace (Titus 1:1-16)

Background to the Letter to Titus

- Author: The Apostle Paul
- Date of writing: Between A.D. 60-64
- Recipient: Titus, Like Timothy, Titus was entrusted with the care of churches. After accompanying Paul on his missionary journeys, Paul left Titus on the island of Crete (Titus 1:5) with instructions to complete what had been left incomplete.

Read Titus 1:1-4

What does Paul tell us about the origins and aims of his ministry?

Why was Paul so confident in his faith and ministry?

Read Titus 1:5-16

Looking at verses 6-9, make a list of the qualifications desirable in an elder/pastor of the church which are here mentioned. Compare them with 1 Timothy 3:1-13. What stands out to you?

Looking at verses 10-16, what was wrong with those whom Paul here criticizes? Make a list of their faults and failings. How, by contrast, are sincerity and genuineness revealed?

What characteristics in verses 6-9 do you need to cultivate? How will you do this?

What characteristics in verses 10-14 do you need to cull from your life? How will you do this?

Read Titus 3
Re-read 3:1-7
How ought we as Christians to behave in relation to:
(a) civil authorities
(b) people around us?
What double awareness about ourselves should inspire such conduct?
Re-read 3:4-7
What are we told here about:
(a) the source and method of salvation
(b) our present state and future hope?
Do you realize as you ought how 'richly' (verse 6) you are endowed?
Re-read 3:8-15
By what actions and by what abstinence should genuine faith in God express itself?
What is necessary on our part to ensure that this happens?
